
Tutorial 7Sameera Irfan

CASE 1: A 62 years old man was in his usual state of health about 6 months back when he started developing drooping of Right upper eye lid. it increased gradually. Associated with binocular horizontal diplopia. Patient confirmed regarding diurnal variation, relapses and remissions.

Examination showed 20/20 VA either eye, pupils brisk, Right moderate ptosis with good elevator function, as shown while lid gradually drooped on sustained up gaze. There was an XT right eye with limited adduction, elevation and depression.

- 1) What is the D/D?
- 2) How would you arrive at the diagnosis and management?



CASE 2: A 32 years old man presented with sudden onset diplopia in primary position over the last 1 month, more severe during mid day and evening. His general health was good, with no associated headaches or neurological symptoms.



Examination: A Head tilt and face turn towards the right.Left hypertropia of 15 PD. Visual acuity 20/20. Normal colour vision. Give your Diagnosis, D/D and management?
